PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As I reflect on the past year as president of the board, the South Bend Education Foundation has experienced an exciting and productive year.

The annual **Great Friends of Schools breakfast** in March featured "Unselfie" author Dr. Michele Borba. The lack of empathy in today's youth has created a self-absorption epidemic that hurts kids' academic performance and leads to bullying behaviors. Dr. Borba presented her research and offered insight that educators, parents, and guardians can use to combat this growing empathy crisis.

With the help of Leadership South Bend/Mishawaka Class 43, multiple copies of "Unselfie" were made available to educators in each South Bend school and to the community at the St. Joseph County Public Library. The goal was to grow awareness of the empathy crisis to help children shift their focus from *I, me, and mine* to *we, us, and ours.*

We were proud to award teachers and principals \$24,000 in grants for innovative classroom projects. I've seen first-hand the impact these grants have had on the dedicated teachers and the students in their classrooms and schools. These committed and talented men and women come into our schools every day with a goal of bringing out the best in each one of their students. Funding of these initiatives gives them one more tool to make a difference.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

It has been an honor and privilege to serve as Superintendent of the South Bend Community School Corporation since July 2016. Our School Board, teachers, and support staff work tirelessly every day for students. But we cannot do it alone. I am truly grateful for the support of our outstanding Education Foundation. Together we are creating a model urban public school system where students are cared for and graduates prepared for the futures they choose.

Academically, our schools continue to provide quality instruction in a stimulating environment. South Bend Schools offer a diversity of programs, services, curricula and opportunities created to make a student's educational experiences the best they can possibly be. District teams are continuing to work to implement additional programs and strategies including assessments to monitor student growth, expansion of our restorative justice practices, providing assistance to our families, and offering social-emotional supports for students.

An immense amount of effort has been put into refreshing and increasing technology. We completed a major milestone by making all schools wireless. More than 1,700 wireless access points were installed in classrooms and new cabling was added which, if laid end to end, would reach from South Bend to Indianapolis. All teachers have been given laptop computers and beginning with the 2018–19 school year, students in grades 6–12 will receive their own laptops. Additional classroom sets of computers are also being provided for students in kindergarten through grade 5.

We believe no other educational system better serves the unique needs of each and every student than South Bend Schools.

We're confident that the quality of education students receive and the values they learn in this great community will serve them well, regardless of where life's journey takes them.

On behalf of all of the employees and students in South Bend, thank you for your involvement with the South Bend Education Foundation.

The Impact of Teacher Grants

ENDOWING EDUCATION INNOVATION — INITIAL GOAL SURPASSED!

The innovative Teacher Grant program was established in 1995 with a modest \$500 teacher grant. The strong response from teachers to the program made it clear to the board that the program must be sustained. The creation of a **Legacy of Learning Teacher Grant Endowment** was formed at the Community Foundation of St. Joseph County with the initial goal of \$500,000.

We are pleased to report that the initial goal was surpassed with help from this year's Give Local St. Joseph County campaign. Your thoughtful donations to the program will grow the number of innovative ideas and important tools that teachers use to benefit the students of South Bend Schools in perpetuity. Additionally, South Bend School employees give back with funding through payroll deductions. As a result of the generosity, the first fully funded \$20,000 in grants will be distributed in 2018.

Thank you to all for your support to help us meet this important milestone.

CIVIL AIR PATROL PROGRAM

The Education Foundation Grant received by the John Adams High School Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program has impacted 15 students by allowing them to participate in a classroom and community-wide Leadership Development Program. The grant paid for necessary classroom equipment, including drill rifles, flags, stands, uniforms, accessories, and science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) equipment and transportation. Consequently, the students were taught to exhibit the core values of integrity, excellence, community service, and respect through common activities such as military etiquette, drill and ceremonies, character development, aerospace education, field trips, physical fitness, healthy living, and aviation safety.


The Impact of Character Education

ONE SCHOOL'S STORY

Marshall Intermediate Center was one of three schools selected in Indiana for the **Promising Practices in Character Education** national awards. Representatives of the school and Education Foundation attended the National Forum on Character Education in Washington, D.C. where the school was honored for their program on how to create a caring community.

Character Education grew to include the larger community this year with the coaching model shared with

250 Bus Drivers, 125 Food Service Staff and 100 New Teachers.
